#### Freight Rail Link Between Adelaide and Sydney

Council has unanimously resolved to support in principle a proposal by a consortium to establish a freight rail link between Adelaide and Sydney.

The proposed link would use the existing infrastructure between Berri and Adelaide and Junee to Sydney with a new link between Berri and Junee. It would be dedicated to freight transport and will result in less heavy road transport on the highways.

The draft proposal was presented to Council by John Perry who has returned to live in Hay after many years in Sydney where he was Mayor of Holroyd City Council for several years.

#### CASE Memorial

Council has approved in principle an application by CASE to erect a shelter/seating memorial in the vicinity of Brewery Park in honour of those who have died at the their own hand. Details of the proposed memorial have not yet been determined and will be the subject of consideration by neighbours and Council in due course.

#### Telstra Advice on new NBN Service

The Griffith Telstra Store will be in Hay to assist residents with any enquiries they may have regarding connecting to the new NBN service. A Telstra pop-up shop will be operating out the front of the Council Administration Building at 134 Lachlan Street and will operate between 10am and 5pm on the 6, 9, 14, 16, 21, 23, 28 and 30 March.

## Inquiry - Augmentation of Water Supply for Rural & Regional NSW

Deputy Mayor Cr Michael Rutledge and General Manager Allen Dwyer attended the Legislative Council General Purpose Standing Committee No.5 Inquiry into the Augmentation of Water Supply for Rural and Regional New South Wales in Griffith on the 1st March.

The inquiry was chaired by the Hon Mick Veitch with representatives from all major parties receiving evidence from several local interest groups concerned with a future sound water supply for irrigation purposes. Attention was drawn to the need for more water storage facilities to mitigate flood events and guarantee a reliable source of water for irrigators.

The Coffey Report into the inland diversion of the Clarence River (about 1985) was promoted by some groups as a part solution.

The need for a reliable water resource for irrigation and development was stressed as a necessity if decentralisation is to be successful in country areas.

Change of April Ordinary Meeting Date: Due to Anzac Day falling on the April Ordinary meeting day, the April Ordinary meeting of Council has been brought forward to Tuesday 18th April.

On the morning of Tuesday 28th February, Council hosted a Business Breakfast at the Bishop's Lodge Motor Inn, in conjunction with Back to Business Week.

Back to Business Week is an initiative funded by NSW Department of Industry to celebrate small/medium businesses and assist with starting, growing or innovating your business. The event was held with the support of the Business Enterprise Centre (BEC) who provided a presenter, Peter Douglas, to speak on Cashflow Management.

The breakfast was attended by around 20 businesses, which was a great turn out. It is hoped to have more workshops like this in the future and all businesses are encouraged to take advantage of the opportunity when it arises.
